

# REDUCED CHORUS FEES TO CONTINUE - FOR NOW

As you may remember, your management team offered you an option to reduce your CKC fees during May, June and July 2020. At our management team in July, we decided to continue offering this option for the next 3 months (August, September and October 2020) unless we return to rehearsals at St Josephs.

As we will still have to pay your SAI/SAA membership fees, we will require you to continue to pay the Escrow Account portion of your monthly fees.

A couple of important things to note:

- Should the amount in your Escrow Account not be enough to cover your SAI/SAA membership fees when they fall due, you will be invoiced for the shortfall amount.
- 2. Normal fees will apply for all members once we begin rehearsing at St Josephs.

# MEMBER PROFILE - INESE VELTA KAMENYITZKY (GULBIS)

Part you sing: In my early years with CKC I sang Lead but then I was asked to switch to Baritone.

When did you join CKC? I attended the Divas, Learn to Sing A capella Course in April 2007 and became a member in October 2007.



# Brief personal history:

My family arrived in Australia in Nov. 1948 as displaced persons from Latvia in Europe after World War 2. My brother & I grew up attending Latvian Saturday school and participating in many Latvian cultural activities over the years. We lived in Cecil Park and went to school on the western rural fringe of Sydney. My parents encouraged us to study hard & go to uni (where I also met Peter, my husband of 40+ years) so that we could have a better life than they had as primary producers. I became a Geography/social sciences teacher briefly in high school, but hated the revolving door of students so I retrained for primary, which I loved, raised my 3 children then returned to teaching children with disabilities. I now enjoy spending precious time with my 4 grandchildren, playing golf, playing cards, sewing, relaxing near the beach on the Central Coast and entertaining.

#### Brief music history:

Being raised in the Latvian society I grew up singing folk songs in choirs and doing folk dancing at Latvian cultural festivals around Australia.

I learnt to play the piano as a child for about 5 years but wasn't enthusiastic about it. I preferred singing. I was also a member of a popular Latvian folk group for about 10 years during my teenage & young adult years. We even recorded 2 LP records before CDs came along.

#### How did you find out about CKC?

I saw an ad in our local paper for a CKC concert that was being held at the Riverside Theatre, Parramatta & from the moment I heard the first song, I was hooked. I was so impressed by the high standard of singing & harmonies and the obvious fun that was being had by everyone on stage. However it wasn't my time yet so, about 4 years later, when my children were a bit older, I had the time to devote to being a member.



### Chorus Roles you've had over the years

Almost ever since I joined I have been involved with the hospitality and social committees plus taking part in many fundraising activities. I feel that facilitating social times enhances our bonding as members both on and off the risers.

### Favourite Song (from repertoire)

I love so many of them - From oldies such as Let the River Run, Rolling in the Deep, Reach, Take a Chance, to more current ones such as Feels like Home, What Doesn't Kill You, Come to Australia.

I really love the crazy skits and parody songs which are so much fun at our retreats and Christmas parties.

# Best time/worst time/embarrassing time (either/or)

My best times have always been when we sing for the general public eg. Christmas carols in Martin Place, our shows and of course our trips to International in Nashville, Denver and St Louis. My worst/most embarrassing would have to be coming last in a quartet competition.

### What CKC/Sweet Adelines has done for you

As I had never had any formal voice lessons, I initially came to CKC for the expert vocal training provided by Vicki and the music team and the great fun of performing for audiences large & small.

Apart from that, it has been fabulous to form friendships with wonderful women who love singing & performing as much as I do and have accepted me as I am.

#### How are you planning to use this 'off' time?

In the early lockdown times, I had the time to get back into some unfinished craft projects and then, once allowed, getting back into babysitting. I have found it hard to stay focussed on keeping up with singing so it's just great that Vicki has kept us going with new & innovative projects.

#### Your message to the chorus

Find what excites you, join a committee, get involved & make some long term friends in the process. Life is so much better when it's shared, particularly in these uncertain times. Also try to get into a quartet. It's scary at first but is so helpful for improving confidence & skills in singing & performing.
