REDUCED CHORUS FEES TO CONTINUE – FOR NOW

As you may remember, your management team offered you an option to reduce your CKC fees during May, June and July 2020. At our management team in July, we decided to continue offering this option for the next 3 months (August, September and October 2020) unless we return to rehearsals at St Josephs.

As we will still have to pay your SAI/SAA membership fees, we will require you to continue to pay the Escrow Account portion of your monthly fees.

A couple of important things to note:

- 1. Should the amount in your Escrow Account not be enough to cover your SAI/SAA membership fees when they fall due, you will be invoiced for the shortfall amount.
- 2. Normal fees will apply for all members once we begin rehearsing at St Josephs.

MEMBER PROFILE – FRANCES GURTO

I looked on the internet for a singing group near me and CKC popped up. And it turned out to be a capella barbershop. My kids were all young adults and I wanted an activity for myself. I always enjoyed singing so that's what I searched for.



I grew up in Sydney and had an opportunity to work in the

USA with my employer (Burroughs/Unisys) for a period. I was in Florida, met my husband Joe, and lived there for 3 years. Our 3 boys were all born in Australia and are all married. We have 3 grandchildren now.

I have always enjoyed singing and music - school choir, church choir, piano, guitar, ballroom dancing, clogging (American mix of tap and country); always accused of singing on social occasions with work mates etc.

When I started in 2012, the chorus was learning Blame It On The Boogie. I really enjoyed learning it and was delighted at singing it in the group as a harmony part. The song is special to me because of that. I enjoy the variety of songs we do - notably Shelter, Skyfall, Pure Imagination.

I think the most enjoyable singing experiences are the performances other than contest (eg shows) - highly powered but less stress than contest. My first at The Concourse in 2012 is memorable - I had to learn all those songs in a short period of time.
