#### REHEARSALS

As you know we are not able to rehearse together as a large group on the advise of Dr Kerry Chant Chief Health Officer NSW Ministry of Health. In a recent statement (14<sup>th</sup> August 2020) the following advice was included:

Singing in groups (whether by choirs or by congregants) or chanting is a particularly high risk activity and must not take place at this time, irrespective of whether singers or chanters are wearing masks. The only COVID-Safe singing that is permitted is a solo singer distanced at least five metres away from other people and not directly above the audience.

We have had small groups of chorus members gathering together on Wednesday nights to zoom into the rehearsals as a group, and we know that this does bring benefits.

So if you have a safe space where you could host one or two friends over for a rehearsal whilst still practicing safe social distancing, and you feel comfortable doing so, you might like to consider organizing a small group rehearsal at your place.

We do not expect you to do this, and there is absolutely no truth to the rumour that Vicki will expect you to all sing the contest songs live!!

The holiday was originally created by John Baur and Mark Summers in 1995. The idea came to them when one of them got hurt during a racquetball game and yelled out "Arrrr!". They decided it would be funny to make a whole day where people talked like pirates. They chose September 19th because it was Mark's ex-wife's birthday and he figured it would be easy for him to remember.

At first it was just something they did for fun. They figured it would never take off. Then columnist Dave Berry (Miami Herald) wrote an article about it and the day became famous. Now a lot of people celebrate the day because it's fun and silly.

#### Fun Facts About Talk Like a Pirate Day

John Baur uses the pirate name Ol' Chumbucket and Mark Summers is called Cap'n Slappy.

Real pirates were actually bad people who did bad things. The founders of the day want people to know they are not honoring real pirates with this day, but just having some fun.

#### REDUCED CHORUS FEES CHANGING IN NOVEMBER

As you may remember, your management team offered you an option to reduce your CKC fees during May, June and July 2020. At our management team in July, we decided to continue offering this option for the next 3 months (August, September and October 2020) unless we return to rehearsals at St Josephs.

At our last management team meeting, we discussed our ability to continue to offer reduced fees without further damaging CKC's financial situation.

As a result, from November, we will be returning to regular fees for all members whose circumstances have not been affected by COVID. So, if you have not had a loss of income because of the pandemic, we are asking you to revert to paying full membership fees from November. We will continue to offer the reduced fee option for any member who has lost their job and remain unemployed due to COVID.

A couple of important things to note:

- Should the amount in your Escrow Account not be enough to cover your SAI/SAA membership fees when they fall due, you will be invoiced for the shortfall amount.
- 2. Normal fees will apply for all members once we begin rehearsing at St Josephs.
