REDUCED CHORUS FEES TO CONTINUE - FOR NOW

As you may remember, your management team offered you an option to reduce your CKC fees during May, June and July 2020. At our management team in July, we decided to continue offering this option for the next 3 months (August, September and October 2020) unless we return to rehearsals at St Josephs.

As we will still have to pay your SAI/SAA membership fees, we will require you to continue to pay the Escrow Account portion of your monthly fees.

A couple of important things to note:

- Should the amount in your Escrow Account not be enough to cover your SAI/SAA membership fees when they fall due, you will be invoiced for the shortfall amount.
- 2. Normal fees will apply for all members once we begin rehearsing at St Josephs.

The management team would like to thank the members who have continued to pay full fees. We appreciate your continued support as your fees help cover the continued costs of running the chorus.




MEMBER PROFILE -JEN KUMAR

Wearing the false eyelashes the first time was so bizarre and I didn't think there was any way that I could get used to them – or see properly. And when I had my chorus makeup on for the first time, my children were terrified – apparently, I didn't look like their mum!

Best time/worst time/embarrassing time (either/or)

Worst time: So in my early days with the chorus on one of my first workshop weekends, I had a strange sore throat near my ear. On the Monday I saw the doctor and tests came back that I had mumps!!! (Even though I had been vaccinated). My heart sank – knowing how highly contagious it was and I had been on risers and having meals with everyone all weekend. And I thought of all the members with young children, grandchildren and pregnant daughters that I had now put in danger – I felt so awful. But in a true CKC style when I sent a group an email to advise them, they sent back such wonderful wishes of support and love. That's when I knew these fantastic women genuinely cared for me, and everyone in the chorus. Best time: Difficult to choose, but probably when we completed my first concert. The concert was wonderful, but it also was the culmination of a huge amount of work – I think I had to learn about 24 songs. And after lots of times of wanting to throw in the towel, it was a great achievement and all worth it. Big shout out to my section leaders Rach and Liz for all their advice, time and patience.

What CKC/Sweet Adelines has done for you.

I can sing now! I'm fascinated to hear how my abilities have gotten stronger and my voice sounds better. It's great to see Vicki's wonderful methods bare fruit all the time.
