Personal Practice

Regular personal practice means that we come to rehearsals prepared and ready to give our best and to take the next steps in learning and developing our skills. Targeted personal practice means that we objectively assess our singing and performance and look for areas of improvement. Benjamin Zander said "When you make a mistake, throw your hands in the air and say "How fascinating!" Don't just say 'Oh I hate listening to my own voice', but instead develop a curiosity about what happens and take note of specific things that can be addressed: you might notice that your alignment is not correct, or that

your 'ah' vowel isn't resonant, or that you threw a small word/quick note away – then you can begin to work on those things specifically.

Remember that every opportunity to sing is a performance opportunity: if Vicki is working with another part, this is a great time to practice your Visual Communication skills

By practicing and singing mindfully, we will build our skills and become the singers and performers we want to be – what joy and satisfaction that will bring.

On the Sweet Adelines Australia website there are plenty of educational webinars and other resources to support you in your learning.

As International Convention is getting closer, let's all commit to practicing regularly and mindfully, and let's aim to make our audiences eyes shine.

Many of you had the opportunity to try on sample jackets and indicate your preferred size at our recent weekend workshop. Now, we're thrilled to announce that CKC will be covering the cost of these jackets from the Costume Fund. This means the jackets will remain the property of CKC, and we kindly ask that they be returned if you leave the chorus. We also ask that you take good care of your jacket to keep it in excellent condition.

Dual members singing with us in Ohio will also be provided with a jacket, which will need to be returned—along with their costume—after the International Convention. This will also mean that we'll have a few jackets in stock for any new members that join us in the near future.

If you haven't yet had a chance to try on a sample jacket, don't worry! A full range of sizes will be available at rehearsal this Wednesday night. To help keep things running smoothly:

- Basses and Baris: Please arrive early to try on jackets before rehearsal from 6.30pm onwards.
- Leads and Tenors: Please stay for fittings after rehearsal.

It may take a few weeks for the supplier to complete our order, but once the jackets arrive, we know we'll look absolutely fabulous—whether we're at rehearsal, on stage, or out in the community.

Access to Rehearsal Venue

As many of you will know, St Joseph's has undergone re-branding (now known as Mary MacKillop Spirituality Centre), and has been making some changes which have affected our riser storage and also access to the centre. On Wednesdays, usually there will be a receptionist only until 7pm so the first person who arrives first will need to wedge open the side door near the Pacifica room so that members can access the Centre for our rehearsals. For security reasons we have decided to close the side door at 8pm. If you need to access the centre after that time, please call a member to ask for the door to be opened. If we know in advance that you will be late we can leave the door open longer for you, and you should close it when you enter. As always, please make sure that all the lights are off and doors secured at the end of the night.

Scores in Recent Contests

You might be curious about our scores in the two singing competitions we entered recently:

- At the BHA Eastern region contest we received some great comments from the Judges during our evaluation, and we scored 79.4%, which is a great score especially as this was the first performance of these songs – well done everyone!
- For the Sydney Eisteddfod we used our BHA ER video recording as our entry: for this contest we came in second in our category and scored 95%: the judge's comments were high praise indeed: 'Thank you so much for presenting such a well-rehearsed and elegant performance for this Eisteddfod section. The emotional intensity of the first work was very well executed diction and overall quality of sound was consistently warm particularly in the lower voices. Nice clean strong ending with secure intonation well done! Second work provided a wonderful contrast in the program the ensemble clearly enjoyed this work and the engaging story was "sold" very well to the audience we really enjoyed "living it up" with you in this performance. Clean simple choralography supported cleanly executed choral lines beautifully balanced parts overall slight adjustment needed in the final section to stop the chords straying towards the sharper end of acceptable! I really enjoyed this performance and its clear so did the audience Thank you again for submitting I wish you and your ensemble all the very best what a truly lovely group they look like they are making wonderful music and memories together well done to you all!' Ohio Travellers: Things you can do and think about now

Passport / Visa

- Make sure you have a current passport, and that it has 6 months before it expires. Make a
 couple of copies of your Passport, pack one in your luggage and leave one with a family member
 at home.
- Apply for the USA "Visa Waiver" prior to leaving. Visit the ESTA website (see link below).
 Applications may be submitted at any time prior to travel to the United States. The Department of Homeland Security recommends that travel authorization applications be submitted at least 72 hours prior to travel. Unless revoked, travel authorizations are valid for two years from the date of authorization, or until your passport expires, whichever comes first.

Go to the official website to apply or update if you have a current ESTA. Cost is \$21USD https://esta.cbp.dhs.gov/esta

Mobile Phone

- To you use your mobile phone you will need 'International Roaming' switched on through your mobile phone provider before you leave home.
- Investigate what your mobile phone provider has on offer regarding International Roaming at least 1 to 2 months before you leave.
- · Some people may choose to purchase a sim card in the US for their phones you will need to let people know what your new number in the US is
- The Airolo app provides an e-sim which provides data to your phone. You purchase it before you leave and activate it once you arrive. It uses data, so you can make phone calls using WhatsApp or Messenger
- Others may like to purchase a burner phone in the USA to use while you are there

Airalo App

Emma let me know about the Airolo app for phone use when travelling. This is what she has to say about it:

I used it when I last went to the UK for data on my phone and it was cheaper than roaming, could be topped up easily. I couldn't make normal phone calls but could call using messenger or WhatsApp as they use data. Just thought it might be an option for some ladies. You can prepurchase before leaving Australia and activate it on arrival in USA.

I checked the App Store and it has a 4.5 star rating, so it looks great. Another option to consider for those travelling to the US in October. Ohio T-Shirts

To order a T-shirt you will need to:

- Provide Carol with a BLACK T-shirt of your choice (any fabric is fine): it will need to be prewashed WITHOUT fabric softener this helps the design to adhere to the fabric
- Transfer \$15 to the CKC account with your name and Ohio t-shirt in the reference
- This will cover Carol's costs and be a small fundraiser for the chorus
- Carol will return the completed t-shirt once she has been notified that the amount has been transferred into CKC's account
- Please place your t-shirt in a bag labelled with your name

CKC FEE INFORMATION

Circular Keys Chorus charges an annual fee to cover the costs of venue hire for rehearsals and coaching sessions, Director's Honorarium, International and Regional fees, costumes, insurance and other costs related to running an organisation, music and learning tracks, promotional materials such as banners ... and more. As you can see, not all of these expenses are related to running rehearsals, which is why we pay every month including the weeks we do not rehearse (eg Christmas/January break).

The annual fee is broken up into 12 equal payments of \$60 per month. It can be paid annually (\$720), quarterly (\$180), or on another regular basis (always in multiples of \$60 please), but it needs to be paid in advance for a member to be in good standing. These fees are also payable even if you are not attending rehearsals, and if a member is taking leave, fees should still be paid in advance so that membership is maintained. This is because all our costs remain the same, whether or not individual members are attending.

If paying your fees slips your mind, add it to your diary, or set up direct debit so that the fees are paid when due. If you do forget your fees and the Finance Manager reminds you, please pay the outstanding amount promptly. Remember that the Finance Manager is a volunteer, and we need to be considerate of her time by paying our fees regularly and by responding to her requests promptly and with courtesy.

CHORUS PAYMENTS

Please be advised that EFT should be used for your payments to chorus. Please contact our Finance Manager if you need further details, or if you have an issue that prevents you from paying using EFT.

Make sure you include your relevant information in the reference field so the finance team knows who the payment is from and what it is for.
