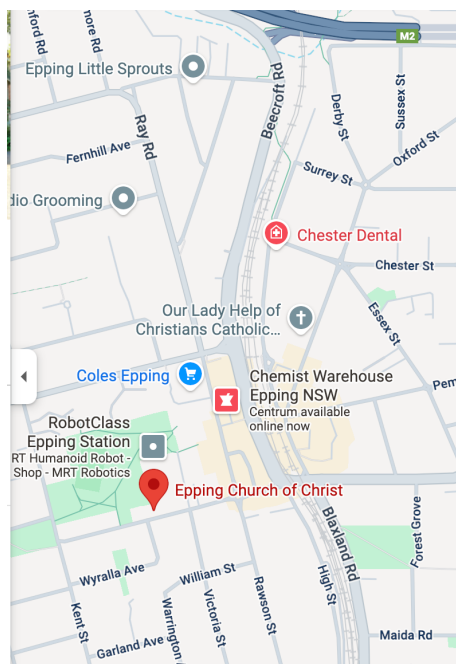
October Rehearsals – Change of Venue – Starting Next Week

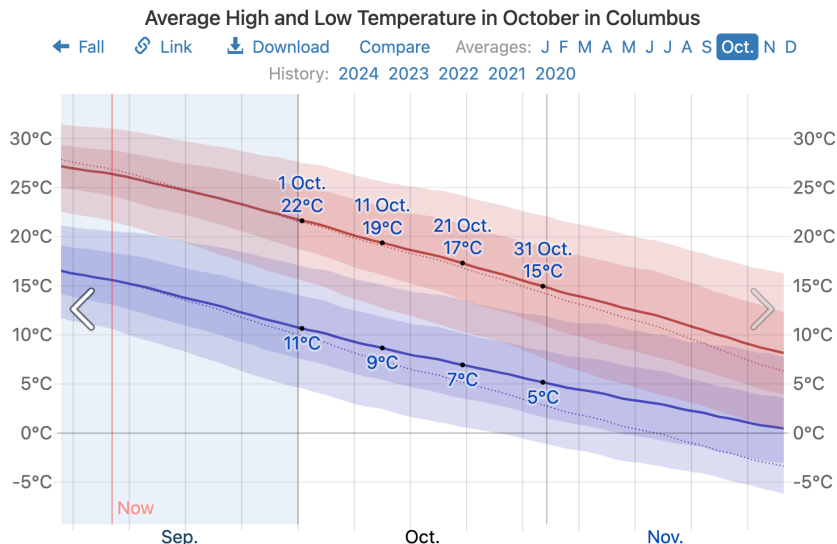
Preparing for Columbus Ohio – Spotlight on Weather

October Weather in Columbus Ohio, United States

Daily high temperatures decrease by 7°C, from 22°C to 15°C, rarely falling below 8°C or exceeding 28°C.

Daily low temperatures decrease by 5°C, from 11°C to 5°C, rarely falling below -1°C or exceeding 17°C.

For reference, on 20 July, the hottest day of the year, temperatures in Columbus typically range from 19°C to 29°C, while on 29 January, the coldest day of the year, they range from -5°C to 2°C.

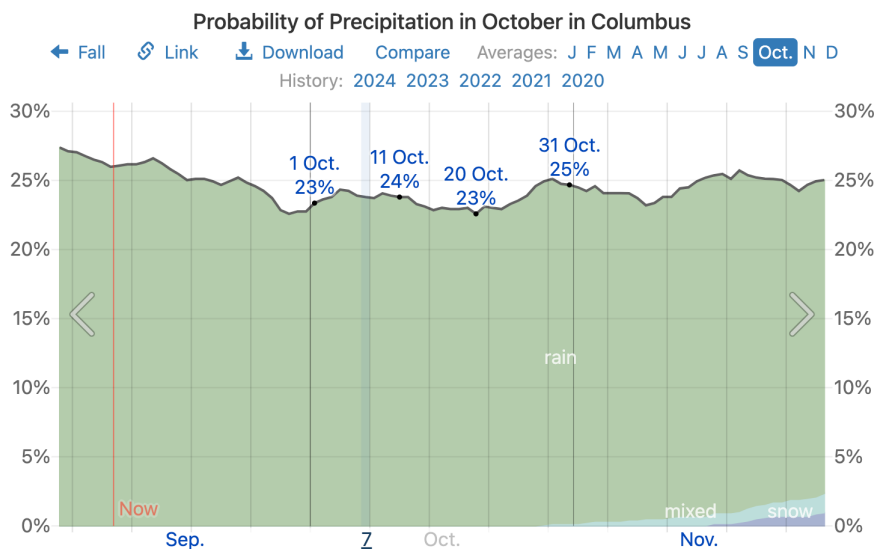


The daily average high (red line) and low (blue line) temperature, with 25th to 75th and 10th to 90th percentile bands. The thin dotted lines are the corresponding average perceived temperatures.

Precipitation

A wet day is one with at least 1 millimetre of liquid or liquid-equivalent precipitation. In Columbus, the chance of a wet day over the course of October is essentially constant, remaining around 24% throughout.

For reference, the year's highest daily chance of a wet day is 41% on 28 May, and its lowest chance is 20% on 28 January.



The percentage of days in which various types of precipitation are observed, excluding trace quantities: rain alone, snow alone, and mixed (both rain and snow fell in the same day).

Travel Advice: USA

You can and should catch up with travel advice at the Australian Government's Smart Traveller website: there is important information here about travelling to the USA. For example, you will need comprehensive travel insurance in case of a medical issue while you are away: costs of medical services in the USA are very high and can be withheld if you do not have the ability to pay. The availability and legality of medications differs between Australia and the USA – make sure you get a

letter from your GP regarding the medications that you are taking (both prescription and non-prescription), and travel with the medication in its original packaging.

Personal Practice

Integrity ☆ Commitment ☆ Fun ☆ Dare to be Different

Regular personal practice means that we come to rehearsals prepared and ready to give our best and to take the next steps in learning and developing our skills. Targeted personal practice means that we objectively assess our singing and performance and look for areas of improvement. Benjamin Zander said “**When you make a mistake, throw your hands in the air and say "How fascinating!"** Don't just say 'Oh I hate listening to my own voice', but instead develop a curiosity about what happens and take note of specific things that can be addressed: you might notice that your alignment is not correct, or that your 'ah' vowel isn't resonant, or that you threw a small word/quick note away – then you can begin to work on those things specifically.

Remember that every opportunity to sing is a performance opportunity: if Vicki is working with another part, this is a great time to practice your Visual Communication skills

By practicing and singing mindfully, we will build our skills and become the singers and performers we want to be – what joy and satisfaction that will bring.

On the Sweet Adelines Australia website there are plenty of educational webinars and other resources to support you in your learning.

As International Convention is getting closer, let's all commit to practicing regularly and mindfully, and let's aim to make our audiences eyes shine.

Sickness and Recovery

We want members to attend as many rehearsals as possible, especially as we are getting closer to International Convention. If you are unwell with something contagious however, it is better for you and other members that you watch rehearsals on our FB live stream. If you are on the mend but unsure if you are still contagious, then wear a mask and sit to the side to prevent the spread of infection. We all want to stay well.

On this point, are your flu and covid vaccinations current? You can also talk to your doctor about a second flu and covid vaccine in the weeks before travelling to the USA to protect you while you are travelling.

Ohio Travellers: Things you can do and think about now

Some information regarding travel preparations from Diane – thanks Di ☺

Passport / Visa

- Make sure you have a current passport, and that it has 6 months before it expires. Make a couple of copies of your Passport, pack one in your luggage and leave one with a family member at home.
- Apply for the USA “Visa Waiver” prior to leaving. Visit the ESTA website (see link below). Applications may be submitted at any time prior to travel to the United States. The Department of Homeland Security recommends that travel authorization applications be submitted at least 72 hours prior to travel. Unless revoked, travel authorizations are valid for two years from the date of authorization, or until your passport expires, whichever comes first. Use our Hotel as the contact address.

Mobile Phone

- To you use your mobile phone you will need 'International Roaming' switched on through your mobile phone provider before you leave home.
- Investigate what your mobile phone provider has on offer regarding International Roaming at least 1 to 2 months before you leave.
- Some people may choose to purchase a sim card in the US for their phones - you will need to let people know what your new number in the US is

- The Airolo app provides an e-sim which provides data to your phone. You purchase it before you leave and activate it once you arrive. It uses data, so you can make phone calls using WhatsApp or Messenger
- Others may like to purchase a burner phone in the USA to use while you are there

Airalo App

Emma let me know about the Airolo app for phone use when travelling. This is what she has to say about it:

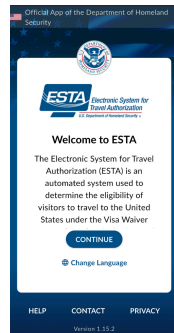
I used it when I last went to the UK for data on my phone and it was cheaper than roaming, could be topped up easily. I couldn't make normal phone calls but could call using messenger or WhatsApp as they use data. Just thought it might be an option for some ladies. You can prepurchase before leaving Australia and activate it on arrival in USA.

I checked the App Store and it has a 4.5 star rating, so it looks great. Another option to consider for those travelling to the US in October. You can find more information about Airalo here:

CKC FEE INFORMATION

Circular Keys Chorus charges an annual fee to cover the costs of venue hire for rehearsals and coaching sessions, Director's Honorarium, International and Regional fees, costumes, insurance and other costs related to running an organisation, music and learning tracks, promotional materials such as banners ... and more. As you can see, not all of these expenses are related to running rehearsals, which is why we pay every month including the weeks we do not rehearse (eg Christmas/January break).

The annual fee is broken up into 12 equal payments of \$60 per month. It can be paid annually (\$720), quarterly (\$180), or on another regular basis (always in multiples of \$60 please), but it needs to be paid in advance for a member to be in good standing. These fees are also payable even if you are not attending rehearsals, and if a member is taking leave, fees should still be paid in advance so that membership is maintained. This is because all our costs remain the same, whether or not individual members are attending.

If paying your fees slips your mind, add it to your diary, or set up direct debit so that the fees are paid when due. If you do forget your fees and the Finance Manager reminds you, please pay the outstanding amount promptly. Remember that the Finance Manager is a volunteer, and we need to be considerate of her time by paying our fees regularly and by responding to her requests promptly and with courtesy.

CHORUS PAYMENTS

Please be advised that EFT should be used for your payments to chorus. Please contact our Finance Manager if you need further details, or if you have an issue that prevents you from paying using EFT.

Make sure you include your relevant information in the reference field so the finance team knows who the payment is from and what it is for.

RISER ETIQUETTE

Just a friendly reminder about riser etiquette: riser etiquette is an important part of showing respect to our fellow members and our Musical Director, Coach, Leaders, or any person who is addressing the chorus. It is always important, but is extra important when we have a coach

- ❖ Pay close attention to the person out the front
- ❖ Do not make comments or suggestions unless you are specifically asked to do so
- ❖ Raise your hand if you have a question
- ❖ Focus on learning
- ❖ Do not chat with other members when the Director or Coach is working with another section – it is distracting and can make it difficult to hear
- ❖ Refrain from phone use unless it is related to chorus work – if you need to use your phone for other reasons please step off the risers and leave the room

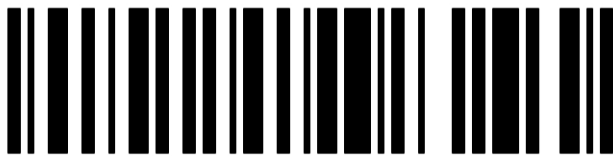
