

2. Preparation & Applying Methods



1. Trim material

- Cut out design with scissors or an electronic cutting machine. (If using an electronic cutting machine, refer to your machine manual to select correct setting and knife for cutting fabric.)
- Keep edges rounded (if possible) to avoid lifting during ironing and washing.




3.b. Ironing onto wood and cardboard

- If you are ironing onto wood or cardboard, the time required will be slightly less.
- Place fabric sheet directly onto your surface, face up (shiny side down).
- Iron fabric sheet, applying medium pressure and keep the iron moving.
- Be sure to iron over all edges making sure they are sealed.
- Turn off iron when finished.

Ironing onto wood and cardboard times:

lmage size	Ironing time
Full sheet	1 minute
1/2 sheet	30 seconds
1/4 sheet	15 seconds




2. Prep workspace

- Place a towel down on a large hard heatresistant surface, such as a wooden table.
- Place your project (eg. garment, bag, pillow) on top of the towel.
- Make sure there is no water in the iron and steam setting is off.
- Set iron to cotton setting and preheat for 5 minutes.
- Iron the towel and your project (eg. garment, bag, pillow) if required to remove extra wrinkles.
- Use extreme caution when ironing. Avoid leaving iron face-down on ironing surface for extended period of time as it may result in injury or damage to the project or ironing surface.



3.c. Sew your printable fabric on

 If you prefer to sew your printable fabric onto your garment/material item, make sure you use a heavier needle and thread or if you're using a sewing machine, choose the setting for heavy cotton material.



3.a. Ironing onto material

- Place fabric sheet face up (shiny side down) on material/garment in desired location.
- Iron fabric sheet, applying medium pressure and keep the iron moving.
- Be sure to iron over all edges making sure they are sealed.
- Turn off iron when finished.

Ironing onto material times:

lmage size	Ironing time
Full sheet	2 minutes
1/2 sheet	1 minute
1/4 sheet	30 seconds


 Make sure that all areas are completely sealed. If you see any lifting on the side or corners, then iron in those areas for a another 5-10 seconds if needed.

3. Finishing & Care



Finish

- After ironing, remove your project from the heating area and allow to cool for 2-3 minutes.
- If image begins to lift, re-iron image focusing on lifting areas.



Care and maintenance

- Wait 24 hours before getting your project wet.
- If needed, it's best to hand-wash items with Printable Fabric in cold water with mild detergent.
- Lay flat to dry.
- Do not use bleach or fabric softener when washing.

IMPORTANT NOTE:

 Machine washing and tumble drying is **not** recommended

Dos and Don'ts of Printable Fabric Sheets:

- · Don't use a laser printer
- · Don't use steam in the iron
- Don't use an ironing board, glass, granite, concrete or other heat sensitive or heat-retaining surfaces
- Do empty all water from the reservoir and put steam setting to off
- Do iron on a heat resistant surface, such as a wooden table
- Do follow care and maintenance instructions (outlined in section 3 of these instructions)
