A FASCINATING glimpse into lives long gone has been preserved and is now on show at the Hills District Historical Society Museum.

A treasure trove of memorabilia – from fine china and photographs to farm implements and telephones – is displayed in Building 10 at Balcombe Heights Estate.

The historical society's president Julie Graham admits that the collection of 15 wedding dresses (including a purple dress that is at least 150 years old) are among her favourite exhibits, along with farm equipment.

All items are linked to the Hills district, including the old school room filled with desks from Castle Hill Public School.

Mrs Graham has been a member of the society for 17 years and its president for the past 10.

"Our shire has a wonderful history, significant in the early life of this state and nation," she said.

"We need to embrace it as we move into new and exciting times, but we must not forget where our shire has come from."
